Leonard Kowalski informed the Board that the Heating, Ventilating and Air Conditioning Service and Preventative Maintenance Work contract was advertised for bids.

3. 2022 EPA Lead and Copper Monitoring Program

Sabrina Figler advised the Board that the 2022 Lead and Copper Monitoring Program has been completed. Ms. Figler gave a brief recap of the study including all results. She advised that at the current time the results from the study indicate that our current corrosion control treatment program is effective in preventing the lead and copper into our drinking water. Chairman Schad asked if she had any idea on the projected change in regulations and whether any of the results of this are going to show up because of a change in the threshold that we are going to be at the cusp of having reportable events. Ms. Figler advised that we extrapolated based on the results on this study, and at this point in time, it looks like the Authority will be above the action level in 2025, as the proposal stands now. Commissioner Schad further asked if there are solutions that we can start to implement so we are below the action level. Mr. Kowalski noted that the Authority has been working on those for the past several years, and the Pipe Loop Study will tell us if we need to make any changes in our current corrosion control process. 4. 2022 Lead and Copper Monitoring Program Results
