## ITEM 3 - AWARD OF CONTRACT TO CMH COMPANY, INC. FOR CONTRACT NO. CPL-005, WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS IN THE VILLAGE OF SLOAN, NEW YORK, PROJECT NO. 201900072 - \$2,570,580.00

#### DISCUSSION

Vice Chairman Carney expressed his concern as to the bids coming in significantly higher than the engineer's estimate in items 3, 4 and 5. Mr. Kowalski noted that item 3 is a waterline improvement project, and items 4 and 5 are restorations contracts. Mr. Kowalski explained that the quantities are calculated over the last three contracts so there will be about 5.5 years of data when the contracts are prepared. We use all the unit prices from the previous contracts and put escalation clauses on them and go through the quantities and try and see which ones make sense versus dollar wise. Historic numbers are used to do the engineer's estimate for the restoration contracts. He added that after the bids came in, he spoke with the contractors, and he was told they went through and had all their data versus what they bid versus what their actual costs were. According to the contractor, they had significant losses on multiple items throughout these contracts. Therefore, they adjusted their numbers based on what they were actually spending to do the work which is reflective in the bids that received.

A discussion was held if it was possible to verify the contractor's numbers and how can the engineers prepare an accurate budget. Chairman Schad remarked that in terms of auditing, we ought to be looking at this over the next two years and find a way to measure those elements that have driven the price up and whether they're real. Ms. Murphy did not feel that a clause allowing the Authority to review the contractor's books would be possible.

Vice Chairman Carney feels we should have a way to be able to verify material. Mr. Kowalski clarified that the Construction Inspectors do not have a way to do that. They can only verify number of people on the job and hours on the job. He added that these are unit cost contracts. Contractors are bidding on a cubic yard of concrete, on square footage of asphalt, and on square footage of lawn. So, when our inspector goes out, he measures up the amount of concrete required, amount of asphalt and lawn.
