#### A) SECRETARY

#### 1. Executive Session

Chairman Schad asked that the Executive session be discussed at the end of the meeting.

#### 2. Civil Service Approvals

Secretary McCracken reported that he has received Civil Service approval for Chuck Abdallah (Crew Chief), Michael Quinn (Sr. Distribution Engineer) and John DelMonte (Associate Attorney Part-Time). Chairman Schad requested an updated organizational chart for the Commissioners. Mr. McCracken replied that he will have the chart for the Commissioners next week.

#### B) LEGAL

#### 1. Lawley Services, Inc.

Karen Prendergast reported that in June of 2019 the Authority entered into a one-year professional services agreement with Lawley Services to provide brokerage services for insurance. The intent was to issue an RFP for brokerage services before the 2020 renewal. However, due to the retirement of the former Risk Manager along with people working from home the last several months, the RFP was never issued. Ms. Prendergast told the Board that she and Ms. Murphy are recommending that the Board extend this agreement for one year with no additional costs. She also added that since the retirement of the former Risk Manager, Lawley has taken over several responsibilities that the Authority previously performed in-house. They handle risk assessments for contracts, review our insurance or insurance certificates to make sure that they're placed with equitable companies at no additional cost. Ms. Prendergast noted that there is a resolution on today's meeting authorizing the extension. The resolution also authorizes Ms. Prendergast to sign all insurance documents to bind coverage for the Authority. Lawley Services will be speaking at the next meeting about options with respect to renewals. Commissioners Schad and Carney both agreed that it is a good idea to authorize Ms. Prendergast to sign all insurance documents to bind coverage.

#### 2. Policy 43.0 Waiver

Karen Prendergast noted that pursuant to the Authority's Policy No. 43, employees are eligible for medical and dental coverage for which they are responsible for, and contribute to a portion of the monthly premium cost. Two of the part-time attorneys who have been furloughed since the beginning of the emergency period contribute to the premium for medical and dental coverage. Ms. Prendergast added that there is a resolution on the meeting requesting to waive the monthly healthcare contribution for the two part-time attorneys only who have not been issued a payroll check but remain on the active payroll. The Commissioners agreed to waiving the policy.

#### C) FISCAL

#### 1. Procurements

Karen Prendergast asked the Board that if they had any questions regarding the list of procurement purchase orders and payments of master purchase orders that she had approved. Commissioner Carney noted he reviewed the list, and it is appropriate.

#### 2. April 2020 Investment Report

Karen Prendergast distributed the April 2020 Investment Report along with a brief explanation of the report.

#### 3. Monthly Financial Report – April 2020

Karen Prendergast distributed the April 2020 Monthly Financial report which includes operating revenue, investment income, operating expense and net income. Ms. Prendergast mentioned that modifications to the report were made highlighting some of the expenses that are unique to the pandemic.

#### **D) OPERATIONS**

#### 1. RFP – Sturgeon Point Piping & Valve

Leonard Kowalski informed the Board that the Authority recently issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) for the design of a series of improvements related to the filtration system of the Sturgeon Point Water Treatment Plant. RFPs were issued to four consulting engineers: Arcadis, GHD, Nussbaumer & Clark, and Hazen & Sawyer. Another three firms obtained the RFP through our website (O'Brien & Gere, CPL, and Barton & Loguidice). In the end, two firms, Arcadis and GHD, chose to submit proposals for this project. The proposals were reviewed and discussed among the engineering staff, and it was determined that Arcadis provided an experienced project team to perform the work and demonstrated a higher degree of current, direct experience with recent/ongoing work in facilities of comparable treatment technology and capacity to the Sturgeon Point WTP.

Mr. Kowalski noted that if there are no objections, the Engineering Department would like to negotiate a Professional Services Contract with Arcadis. The Board had no objections.

#### 2. Budget Update

Mr. Kowalski prepared a budget update for the Commissioners. Each unit of the Production and Engineering Departments were reviewed for capital spending to date and projected spending for the remainder of the year. He went through a brief description of the status for each unit. Chairman Schad commended Mr. Kowalski on a great job preparing this report. However, he would like two things added: 1. make the description of the project clear in order to be able to identify and know where the project is. 2. incorporate target dates for each project such as the date the Board will authorize the issuance of an RFP and start date of the project. Chairman Schad remarked that doing so will allow us to monitor how we are going to achieve these dates. Commissioner Carney inquired if Chairman Schad would like this done for all the projects. Chairman Schad replied that he feels it should be done for all the projects because we're expanding our capital budget each year, and we're going to have a heavier lift each year, and we've got to manage how we get there.
