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Plaintiff, by her attorney, PAUL T. BUMBALO, ESQ., complaining of the defendant, herein alleges:

- 1. The plaintiff is a resident of the State of New York, Erie County.
- 2. The defendant is a Authority according to the operation of law with offices located in the County of Erie, and State of New York.
- 3. On or about Wednesday, December 12, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. Plaintiff pulled down East Payne Street and noticed wet pavement in a certain area of the road. Neighbors who noticed the same wet pavement also went to investigate same. Neighbor Paul Grejszak determined said wet pavement was a water main break; he called the ECWA Emergency Hotline at approximately 10:00 p.m. on December 12, 2018 and reported the issue. He waited and when no one from the ECWA arrived, he called the ECWA Emergency hotline again and still no one responded.
- 4. On or about Thursday, December 13, 2018, Plaintiff heard a loud crash noise; plaintiff began looking for source of noise. When plaintiff got to the top of the basement stairs, there were boxes floating in water that was approximately two feet off of the floor. Plaintiff called an employee of the Village of Lancaster DPW and was told the Crew Chief would immediately be notified and would send someone out.
- 4. Two Village employees from the DPW arrived, upon seeing the amount of water one of the employees placed a call to the ECWA and told them to expedite someone immediately. The Village employees then hooked up a pump and began pumping out the water. Shortly afterwards, the ECWA trucks arrived as well as the gas company and electric company.

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5. An ECWA crew supervisor referred Plaintiff to speak with an ECWA adjuster. Upon speaking with said adjuster, said adjuster advised that an investigation had to be done before ECWA could do anything. The adjuster sent Plaintiff forms to fill out via e-mail and to told Plaintiff to contact her insurance company. Plaintiff complied with both requests. so, Plaintiff was notified by her insurance carrier that she was not covered for such loss.

6. The pump pumped water continually out of Plaintiff's basement for more than 24 hours. During this time, Plaintiff had no heat or hot water. Plaintiff called several plumbers before finding one who was available 24 hours. The plumber was able to restart the furnace but the water tanks were ruined. Said water tanks could not be replaced until late evening of December 14, 2018. The plumber sent a furnace technician to evaluate the dependability of the furnace due to the level of the water in the basement. Carpeting, items stored on the floor and the potential of mold growing is a concern.

AS AND FOR A CAUSE OF ACTION, PLAINTIFF ALLEGES AS FOLLOWS:

7. Defendant, the Erie County Water Authority failed to maintain underground pipes.

AS AND FOR A SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION AGAINST THE DEFENDANT

ALLEGES AS FOLLOWS:

8. Defendant was notified of the condition and failed to respond, and once notified of the condition failed to respond to correct the correction, failed to drain the water off to continue additional flooding and damage to the plaintiff's property, etc.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff demands judgment against the defendant in the amount of \$25,000.00
