It could be dire if they was a fire and no access to water if 18 mile creek was at low levels.

I am writing to you regarding the 1.5 million dollars misappropriated/ unaccounted funds in the town of Boston.

As a concerned 30 year resident and homeowner I feel that the citizens of this town need to have whomever is responsible for our tax contributions reimburse the funds back to the taxpayers.

I have endured 30 years of broken promises from every elected official promising to install public water for there vote. Not only have we stood the test of time but have paid for other water districts in our town water access.

Our road on Back Creek has been washed out, pot holes, safety guard rails removed and never replaced, snow plow removal is never a priority because we live basically on the one lane part of Back Creek. We

pay as our taxes and expect to have the same treatment regardless of the demographics.

In my 30 years of residence I have only seen one fire drill which water has to be pumped from 18 mile creek. In an emergency situation I don't think responders can maintain water pressure and predict water levels to be appropriate to extinguish fires. We live on a tree lined street which is a big concern if a fire was to erupt and don't feel we share the same safety regulations as other residents in our town.

My request as you can attest to is legitimate there are 4 properties in between municipal water 8424 Back
Creek rd, 8444 Back Creek rd, 8476 Back
Creek rd, 8576 Back Creek rd. My neighbor Martin Rejewski is a general contractor and submitted a legend and survey of Erie county Water Authority diagrams of said properties. Needless to

say, we have yet to hear or see any surveyors to remedy our concerns. It is criminal to steal and those responsible should be held liable. I have paid my taxes in full and on time for 30 years. We are owed the same treatment from our local government.






And 8620 Backcreek / Bob & kathy Wozniak on the other side toward Hillcroft rd.also have Municipal water.


Leaving only 4 properties in between with out Municipal Water.



Dear Ms. Hammell:

I am in receipt of your email discussing public water on Back Creek Road in the Town of Boston.

I visited the area you discussed in your email. While dodging pot holes and crumbling shoulders, I was able to see the municipal water sources. Viewing the distance between the hydrants in person allowed me to better visualize your concerns regarding fire safety. I also noted your concerns regarding Eighteen Mile Creek, whose levels seemed rather low, despite the recent rain. While I am not a fire fighter and cannot speak to the adequacy of water to fight fires, I can certainly understand your concern.

I also reviewed town budget regarding the possibility of theft regarding water on Back Creek Road. While nothing in particular stood out on my cursory review which would cause alarm, I do not have the authority to fully audit the necessary parties to better evaluate the situation.

The office which would have broader authority to look into your concerns is the Office of the New York State Comptroller. They have authority to audit

municipalities as well as New York State created authorities, which would include the Erie County Water Authority.

With your permission, I would like to forward your concerns to the New York State Comptroller.
